RULEBOOK REVISION

RSC's Speed Committee remains committed to building a sustainable structure for long-term-growth for RSC Speed and the sport of roller and inline speed skating in Canada.

Two important and recent changes implemented by the Speed Committee include a drawing-up of a set of by-laws that govern the election and operation for RSC Speed and a revision of the rule book.

As a result of much work, the Rules for RSC Speed were published and distributed in March 2013.

The Rules for RSC Speed include a number of changes, including a revision of age categories, distances, and the creation of the Open category. The Open category allows for skaters of Junior, Senior, Master and Grand Master age categories to compete together.

Other changes include allowing officials to decide, based on certain criteria, if different categories should be combined to provide skaters with a better racing experience.

Another important change is the use of a new points system. Points awarded to each participant will be based on the number of participants for each distance. For example, if there is one skater in a distance, that skater will earn 1 point. If there are two skaters, first place will earn 1 point and second place will earn 2 points. Also, the top-5 finishers of each distance will receive bonus points with 0.5 for 1st, 0.4 for 2nd, 0.3 for 3rd, 0.2 for 4th and 0.1 for 5th.
